


Help with Britannica

Once the best known reference book in the world, Encyclopædia Britannica is now the most prestigious online encyclopædia. It is the first place to look for information on absolutely anything.

How to use Britannica

Go to [eInformation: Online Reference Library](#) and click **A-Z of electronic resources**.




Then scroll down to **Britannica Library**.



Note that there are three levels of complexity: **Adult**, **Student** and **Junior**. Select the appropriate level for your search.

If you log into **Britannica Library** from **outside the library**, you will need to enter your library card number to gain full access.



Below are the results of an **Adult** level search for information on **David Bowie**. The search term is typed into the **search box** at the top of the Britannica page. A list of results is shown below. Click on the **article title highlighted in blue** to view the article in full.



Once you have opened the article, you'll notice there are a number of options available at the top right, including **print**, **email**, **translate** and listen.



In addition to the article, Britannica Library also provides links to **images**, **video clips**, **magazine articles** and **relevant websites**. These are accessed from a toolbar on the left side of the search results page.
